Equal justice under law.

Those words are etched into the U.S. Supreme Court Building. They hung over my daughter Claire and I most of the morning of April 22 as we joined the Johnson v. Grants Pass rally in Washington, D.C.

The Court ultimately ruled that people experiencing homelessness can be penalized, ticketed, and charged with a crime for sleeping outdoors...EVEN WHEN THERE IS NO AVAILABLE SHELTER IN THE AREA.

Justice – particularly the definition that reads "treatment that is morally right or fair" – is a driving force of nearly all we do here at Hesed House.

To us, there is nothing morally right or fair about any man, woman, or child experiencing homelessness – shelter or unsheltered.

I went to Washington, D.C. to fight and be a voice for those we serve.

But that rally alone will not bring justice or end homelessness...

The fight that happens each and every day right here at Hesed House will.

And we need each and every one of you reading this in that fight.

To each of the vulnerable men, women, and kiddos we serve at Hesed House and on the streets...

Your time, energy, support, donations, volunteering...
...bring dignity
...re-affirm their humanity

...help them move another step closer to ending their homelessness

You are on the front-lines for justice for our neighbors in-need.

Homelessness is impacting more people than we have ever seen in our 41 years of existing.

HESED HOUSE STAFF BECOMES LIKE FAMILY

In October of 2018, Shannon realized she had nowhere to go. She had just gone through an emergency appendix surgery and her then-partner left her stranded in the hospital. Her only choice was to take a cab to Hesed House at 1 in the morning. After staying in our shelter, she has returned to independent living and still returns to connect with our staff whom she grew close to.

Shannon's journey with Hesed House was not a simple one. She went through many difficult situations but she always knew she could count on the staff to be there for her.

"I still consider this like my second family [...] This is the healthiest area for me...I know what to do now and I'm not losing what I have".

During her time at Hesed House, Shannon found herself in a complicated relationship and at times staff helped her navigate it. Additionally, sometimes our guests will try a new living situation and it doesn't work out. As Shannon states, "I kept going back [to Hesed after leaving] but the staff accepted me and didn't turn me away".

- 292 households obtained homeless prevention assistance so they did not have to enter our shelters.
- 27 individuals reunited with families.
- 148 individuals and families obtained housing.
- 97 individuals obtained identification.
- 299 individuals obtained assistance for medical need.
